Make a Communication Timeline

The way that we maintain connections has evolved throughout history. From cave art came symbols that eventually led to cuneiform and hieroglyphs. The development of alphabet systems was a huge leap for communication that brought about processes developed to share and send written or coded messages and information. Electricity changed everything and the invention of the telegraph, followed by the telephone, significantly transformed the way we communicate and stay connected.

- Where do you think telephone technology will go in the future?






Imagine a Time Before Cell Phones
